

Visitation hours: If you would like to visit a detained immigrant in this facility, you must do so Friday – Monday from 8:00 AM – 6:00 PM.

#### Visitation Rules

- Visits will last a minimum of 30 minutes
- Visitors may only visit a detainee once a day
- All visits shall be "non-contact." This includes, family, friends, colleagues, etc.
- No firearms or weapons of any kind are permitted in the facility
- If visitors are or appear to be intoxicated, visitation will not be allowed
- All visitors are subject to search while in the facility
- Visitors are not allowed to pass or attempt to pass any items to detainees
- Visitors are not allowed to carry any items into the visitation area

If you need to get a hold of any detainee at this immigration detention facility you must call 714.935.6940. You will need to have the immigrants full name, alien registration number and your contact information where you can be reached (name, telephone, etc.).

## **Immigration Bond Information for the James A. Musick Facility**

Delivery bonds (i.e., immigration bonds) cannot be posted in-person directly at the James A. Musick Facility. Instead, family members or associates can post an immigration bond at any of the 82 ICE-ERO facilities around the country that accept immigration bonds. The closest facility to the James A. Musick Facility that accepts immigration bonds is located at 300 N Los Angeles Street, Suite 7621, Los Angeles, CA 90012. Immigration bonds can be posted Monday-Friday (except holidays) at this facility from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Bonds cannot be posted directly at the James A. Musick Facility.

To post an immigration bond for someone detained at this facility, you must have a money order, cashier's check or certified check. If the bond amount exceeds \$10,000 and over, you can only pay by single cashier's check or a certified check. All payments should be made to the "US Department of Homeland Security" or "Immigration and Customs Enforcement." Customs Enforcement."

If you do not want to post the bond in-person yourself, you can also have a licensed immigration bond agent post the bond for you. For a small fee, ranging from 2% - 10%, an agent can post the bond for you electronically, so that you do not have to travel to the ICE ERO facility. This process is typically faster and easier than posting a bond yourself.

## **ICE Detainee Information**

To search for a detainee, visit www.cfiaus.com and have the detainee's first and last name the detainee's country of birth. You can also call ICE directly with the information below.

#### How to get information on an ICE detainee

Please call the Field Office Main Telephone Number, (714) 712-8074. Please have the following detainee information available:

- First name
- Last name (including hyphenated last names)
- Any aliases the detainee might use
- Date of birth
- Country of birth

#### How to get in touch with an ICE detainee

Please have the following detainee information available:

- Full name
- Alien Registration Number (A Number)
- Your name and telephone number

# Frequently asked questions about the James A. Musick Facility

#### Does the facility have public parking?

Yes. If you know someone who is detained at the James A. Musick Facility in Santa Ana California and you would like to visit them, there is free public parking available. The parking will be designated for visitors.

#### Can I post a bond for someone who is detained at this facility?

It really depends on the specific details of the case surround the immigrant/alien that you are looking to bond out. If an immigration judge has set a bond in the immigrant's case, then yes, you may bond someone out from this facility. See the next question below, regarding the various locations where bonds can be processed.

#### If I am bonding someone out, do I post the bond here or or in another location?

All bonds posted for any alien detained may be posted at any Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE) Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) bond acceptance offices around the country between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 PM (except public holidays) local time. There are 82 ICE-ERO offices where bonds can be posted (8 locations in California). You can find a list of facilities on the ICE website.

#### What is the easiest way to bond an ailen / immigrant out of jail?

There are two ways to bond an alien/immigrant out of the James A. Musick Facility. First, one can show up at one of the 82 ICE-ERO bond accepting offices in person during business hours. Second, someone can utilize the services of a bonding agent who is able to post the bond electronically so that family members do not have to go to one of these ICE-ERO locations in person. Additionally, when a family uses the services of a bonding agent the detained individual will be released much sooner.

## **California ICE Detention Facilities**

Not every ICE detention facility allows you to post an immigration bond in California. If you would like to post an immigration bond it must be done at an ICE-ERO facility that accepts immigration bonds.

There are 7 ICE detention facilities in California. They are as follows:

- Adelanto ICE Processing Center
- Santa Ana City Jail
- Yuba County Jail
- Mesa Verde ICE Processing Facility
- James A. Musick Facility
- Imperial Regional Detention Facility
- Otay Mesa Detention Center

If you need an easier way to post an immigration bond for someone who is detained at an immigration detention facility in California, **you can post an immigration bond through a licensed immigration bonding agent by calling (844) 910-2342**. That agent can post a bond for you electronically for any detention facility in California and around the US.
